TO FILE A CLAIM FOR REIMBURSEMENT:

- **IF YOU ARE IN A ANTHEM POS/PPO PLAN** log-in to your member portal at www.anthem.com or use your Sydney mobile app to submit a claim online. If you would prefer to mail a paper claim, please contact the Fund Office at 800.241.3473 for information on how to obtain and complete the required form.
- **IF YOU ARE IN A KAISER HMO PLAN** log-in to your member portal at www.kp.org, go to “Coverage and Costs” and then select “Submit a Claim”

REMEMBER TO SAVE YOUR RECEIPT: A copy of your receipt will be required for reimbursement!

RECEIVE FREE TESTS WITHOUT HAVING TO FILE FOR REIMBURSEMENT:

The federal government is providing up to four free at-home test kits per household which can be ordered online at COVIDTests.gov. These tests will ship for free. Additionally, some local governments are distributing OTC COVID-19 tests free of charge at public locations such as libraries and fire stations. We encourage you to contact your local government to find out if this option is available in your area.
